18/69 – PRIORITISATION OF STRONGER COUNTRY COMMUNITY FUNDS

Reference: File No. 45.00

Responsible Officer: Executive Director - Corporate and Community

PURPOSE

The purpose of this report is to seek Council endorsement of the priorities for the allocation of Stronger Communities Funding from the State Government.

REPORT

In February Council was advised that an amount of \$5,251,662 would be allocated to the Hilltops Region as part of the Building Stronger Country Communities Fund. The Fund is specifically designed to provide the kind of infrastructure that improves the lives of local residents. At least half of the allocation is to be spent on sporting facilities. Council considered applications for over \$14 million of funding.

Council staff contacted various sporting groups and community groups across the region to encourage groups to take advantage of the funding. Council is also able to submit its own projects for the grant. All grants must be submitted by Council and Councillors are required to endorse a prioritisation of projects at a council meeting. Only grant applications that have all the required information including quotes are able to be submitted. The final date for staff to have completed applications is COB, Friday 27th April.

Councillors were asked to rank their priorities and the list below represents how the projects rated. While Council has prioritised the projects, further prioritisation and assessment of validity of projects will be undertaken by the State Government. This means that potentially some projects will be removed from the list and Council has been advised to have more projects prioritised than the allocation. Consequently, additional priorities have been added to the list to ensure that there are sufficient projects in this instance to be considered.

Further, as the Hilltops LGA straddles two state government electorates, (Cootamundra and Goulburn) the two state members will also play a role in providing comment on the projects. The following sets out the priority projects for the Goulburn Electorate and also the Cootamundra Electorate. These projects are then prioritised as a combined Hilltops List.

A brief snapshot of the projects is contained in Attachment 1.

These stairs are steep and very difficult to manage carrying items from the museum's collection. They are a WH&S hazard and are referred to as the "stairs to vertigo". The Society was recently bequeathed an old manual printing press and associated paraphernalia (including hand set type) originally from the Boorowa News. The equipment is still largely operational (has been tested) and a local artist and her printmaking friend are excited about the opportunity to hold live demonstrations of century old print making techniques to small groups, although current space in the

museum would not allow this.
