



## Trinity Centre Refurbishment

Proposed SCF allocation: \$100,000

### Background

The Trinity Centre is a heritage listed building that has significance for its social, historical, cultural and architectural values. The building also forms a clear town entry statement to the towns of Harden and Murrumburrah and is a prominent and well-recognised building within the community.

The Trinity Centre currently houses the Harden district library, South West Slopes Zone Rural Fire Service control centre, Murrumburrah-Harden Flexible Care Services Inc. (services delivering Meals on Wheels, personal care, respite care, social support, yard and garden maintenance case management and community transport), and a room for educational instruction for Lambing Flat Enterprises Community Supports.

Improvements that have been carried out previously include refurbishment and enlargement of the library, provision of a disability toilet and access ramp, improvements to the electrical switch board and associated heating/cooling improvements to better support the various community uses within the centre.

### Scope

The scope of the proposed project is to continue further restoration works on to extend the life and reduce the maintenance requirement of the facility and include roof, fascia, gutter and window repair and restoration. The overarching goal of these works is to prevent stormwater ingress that will ensure long term structural integrity and community use of the building. All works will be carried out in keeping with this heritage values of the listed building and in consultation with Council's Heritage Advisor.
